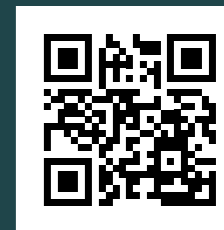

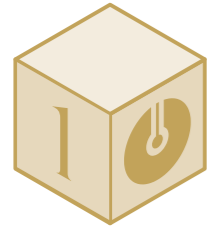

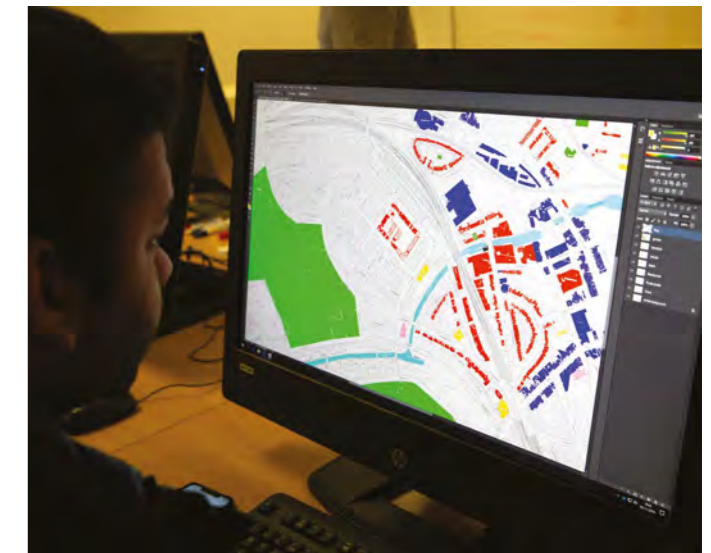
Events and opportunities

Assessments

Your skills and knowledge will be assessed via studio work, practical design projects, presentations, peer evaluations and written assignments including self-reflective essays, written analyses, reports and research.

This degree teaches you the importance of location, context and client, preparing you for a fast-paced, professional career in interior design.

Examining a range of public and private spaces, you'll learn how fresh, new designs are created in response to the purpose of a space and the needs of its user. You'll develop your own personal design approaches and learn to create spaces that improve the lives of those who use them.

You'll develop everything from hand drawings to digital visualisations, 3D prints and physical models before documenting the end results in our photography studio. You'll also be introduced to the financial and marketing aspects of the industry, developing the business acumen to embark on a career as an interior designer.

Your studies will be enhanced by field trips to museums, galleries and exhibitions, and guest talks from industry experts. You'll also have the chance to work on live briefs with real clients – proposing inventive and thought-provoking design solutions for existing London sites, while considering their history, architecture, and social and environmental impact.

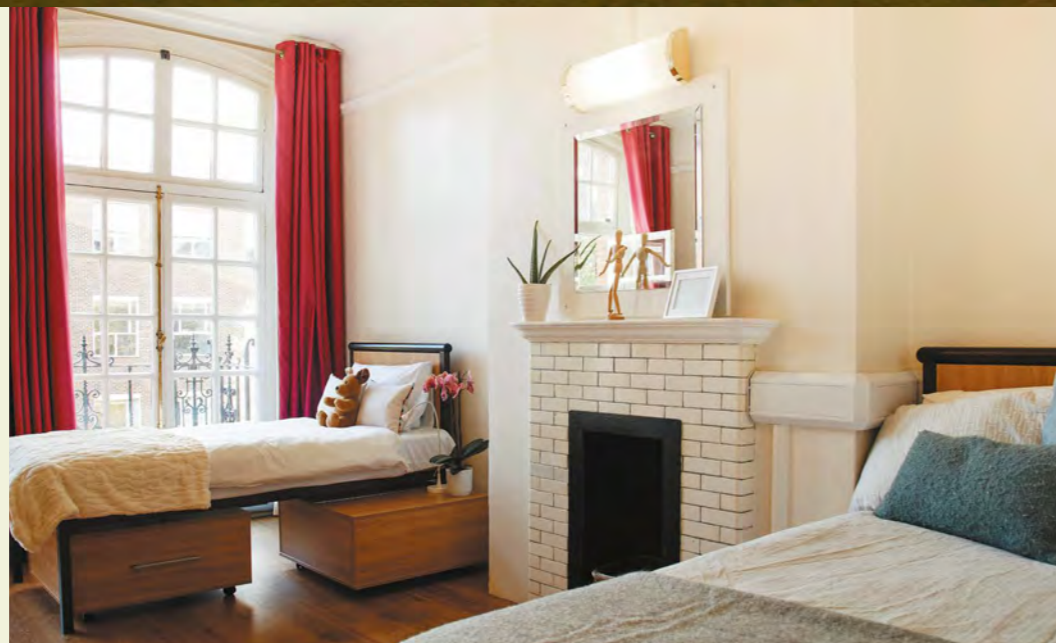
Our partnership with International SOS, a world leader in medical and security advice services, means all Regent's students can access:

If you still have to finish your education, or have yet to attend an interview, we will issue you with a conditional offer. If you've met all conditions, we'll issue an unconditional offer.

Apply at any time – Regent's has a rolling application process. However, some courses fill up quickly, so please get your application in as soon as possible. There's no application fee.

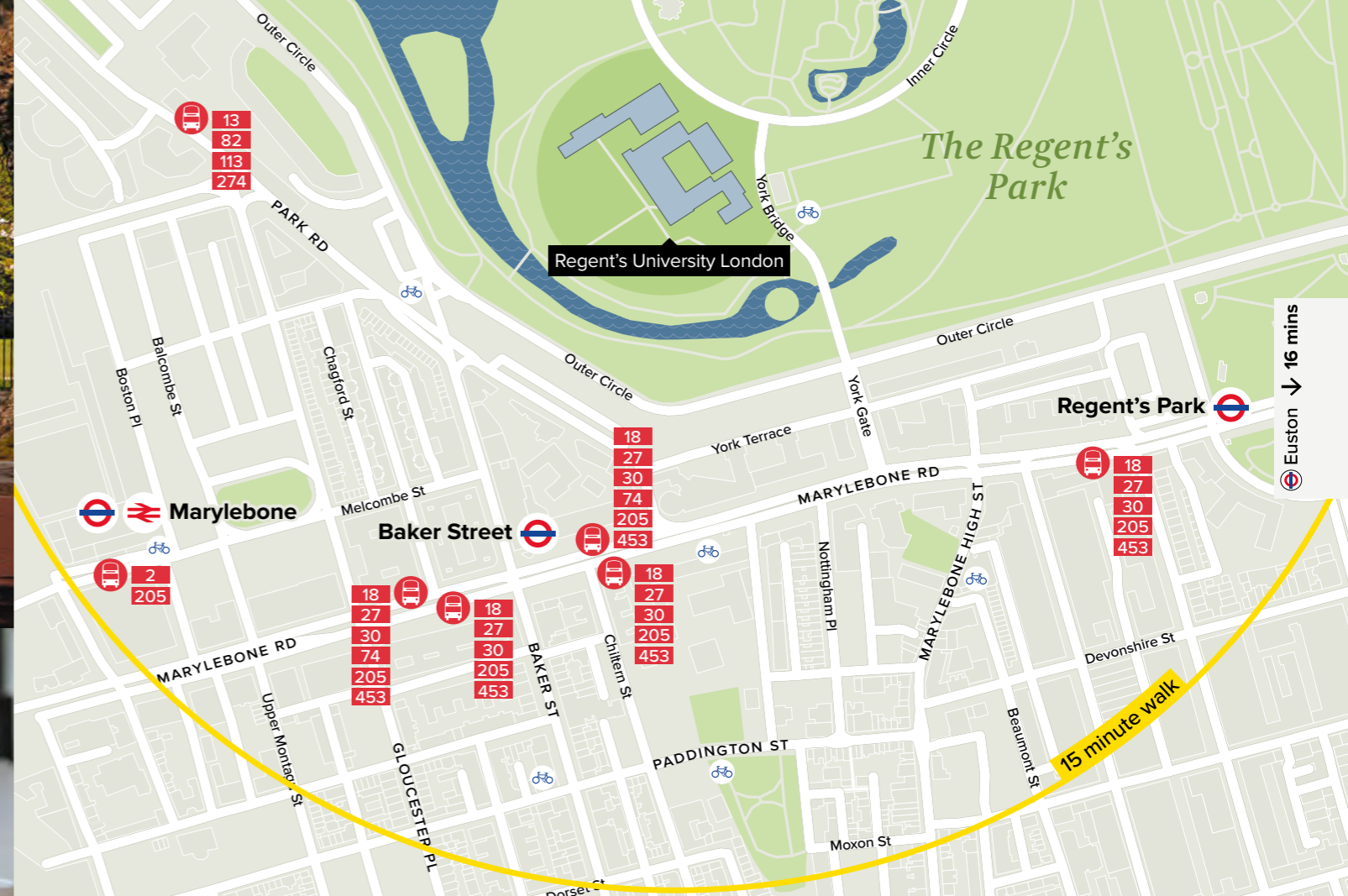

We can't wait to welcome you to Regent's University London. Our campus is easily accessible by public and private transport.

- **By Underground** – Take the London Underground (Tube) to Baker Street station. Plan your journey with the Transport for London Journey Planner: tfl.gov.uk
- **From Baker Street station** – Take the Marylebone Road exit, turn left and walk past the entrance to Madame Tussauds. Turn left onto York Gate and continue over the bridge into the park. The entrance is on your left. ~10 minutes.
- **By road** – Our campus is just off the A501 (Marylebone Road) in central London. Use the postcode NW1 4NS.
- **From London Heathrow Airport** – Heathrow Express train service to Paddington station. Take the London Underground from Paddington to Baker Street station. ~35 minutes.
- **From London Gatwick Airport** – Gatwick Express train service to Victoria station. Take the London Underground from Victoria to Baker Street station. ~60 minutes.
- **From London City Airport** – Docklands Light Railway (DLR) to Canning Town station. Take the London Underground from Canning Town to Baker Street station. ~45 minutes.
- **From St Pancras International** – From Eurostar terminal, take the London Underground from King's Cross St Pancras to Baker Street station. ~10 minutes.
