

ENTRY CRITERIA STATEMENT 2024 – 2025

The admission of students to an Integrated Foundation Course (sponsored at Level 6)

The minimum entry requirement for Level 3 students is:

- > one of the following qualifications:
- 5 GCSEs at grade A-C or equivalent or Grade 5 average
- US High School Year 11 with a minimum GPA of 2.3/4.0
- International Baccalaureate Year 1 with a minimum of 24 points
- Equivalent qualifications as deemed acceptable by the University and set out in the Admissions Guide and UK ENIC
- Applicants who do not meet our A-Level/International Baccalaureate requirements will be considered for the level 3 programme
- minimum English language proficiency requirement through one of the following qualifications (or equivalent):

Admission of students to an Undergraduate Course at Level 4

Business /Liberal Arts/ Psychology

The minimum entry requirement for Level 4 students is:

- > one of the following qualifications:
- Three GCE A-levels in grades A-C
- 24 points in the International Baccalaureate
- US High School Diploma with a minimum GPA of 2.5 PLUS one of the following:
 - three AP tests with an average grade of 3 or two AP tests with an average grade of 4
 - SAT: score of 1100 (550+ in both subjects)
 - ACT with a composite score of 26 (20 in each section)
 - Dual Enrolment and College credits (1st Year) 30 credits with a GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- Equivalent qualifications as deemed acceptable by the University and set out in the Admissions Guide and UK ENIC

- > one of the following qualifications:
- Two GCE A-levels in grades A-C
- 24 points in the International Baccalaureate
- US High School Diploma with a minimum GPA of 2.5 PLUS one of the following:
 - two AP tests with an average grade of 3
 - SAT: score of 1000 (500+ in both subjects)
 - ACT with a composite score of 23 (20 in each section)
 - Dual Enrolment and College credits (1st Year) 20 credits with a GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- Equivalent qualifications as deemed acceptable by the University and set out in the Admissions Manual and UK NARIC
- minimum English language proficiency requirement through one of the following qualifications (or equivalent):

Admission of students to a Postgraduate Course at Level 7 (including MAPC)

The minimum entry requirement for Level 7 students is:

- > one of the following qualifications:
 - Minimum second-class UK undergraduate degree
 - Equivalent international qualifications as deemed acceptable by Admissions and UK ENIC
 - Exceptional entry will be assessed on a case-by-case basis by academic referral only based on:
 - an undergraduate degree lower than 2:2 plus one year of relevant work experience
 - no Level 6 qualifications but three years of relevant work experience (except MSc Psychology)
- MA Psychotherapy and Counselling minimum 120 hours of introductory foundation in psychotherapy and counselling, plus successfully passing an interview.
- MSc Psychology programme minimum Maths requirement through one of the following qualifications (or equivalent):

PGCert Existential Psychotherapy and PGCert Integrative Psychotherapy

The minimum entry requirement is:

- Completion of MA Psychotherapy and Counselling or equivalent, plus successfully passing an interview.
- applicants who have completed the MA Psychotherapy and Counselling with us during the preceding academic year are exempted from providing a personal statement and from being interviewed
