

Code of Conduct – Regent's School of English

Introduction

We are committed to ensuring that Regent's School of English at Regent's University London is a safe and pleasant environment for staff, students, and visitors.

Intention and Consequences

Prospective & current students

This Code of Conduct applies to prospective students who have paid their course fees and have been issued with the acceptance letter from Regent's School of English, and current students at all times, whether on or off campus. This means your conduct off-campus and during vacations, weekends, evenings, and on field trips may be considered. It also means that conduct in a social setting (for example in residences, or on social media) may have consequences whether or not it takes place during normal business hours. Breach of this Code of Conduct may be managed through the Disciplinary Policy Regulations of Regent's School of English.

Expected Behaviour

We treat each other, our wider community and our environment, with respect, kindness and a commitment to equality, diversity and inclusion. To ensure safe, pleasant and welcoming physical and digital environments for everyone.

We are responsible and accountable for our learning, work, behaviours and actions. Including:
